

Why do this course?

Our **CPP30119 Certificate III in Urban Pest Management** course has been designed to deliver the competencies for trainee Pest Technicians to achieve their [General & Timber Pest Control licenses](#), and potential access to federal Traineeship incentives.

This qualification is only offered through online & correspondence delivery methods, whilst under the supervision of licensed/accredited Pest Technician.

In this course students will build knowledge on skills to operate competently and safely as to:

- ❖ Identify urban general and timber pests
- ❖ Assess infestation, cause & severity
- ❖ Develop & communicate management plans with clients
- ❖ Select, maintain & manage equipment and materials
- ❖ Complete applications using appropriate equipment and methods, in line with industry standards.

Units of Competency

Core Units:

- ❖ CPPUPM3005 Manage pests without applying pesticides
- ❖ CPPUPM3006 Manage pests by applying pesticides
- ❖ CPPUPM3018 Maintain equipment and pesticide storage area in pest management vehicles
- ❖ CPPCMN3004 Respond to enquiries and complaints
- ❖ CPPUPM3017 Maintain, service and repair pest management equipment

Elective Units:

- ❖ CPPUPM3008 Inspect for and report on timber pests
- ❖ CPPUPM3010 Control timber pests
- ❖ CPPUPM4001 Assess and select pest management vehicle and equipment
- ❖ CPPUPM4002 Schedule, organise and monitor pest management operations
- ❖ CPPUPM4003 Assess and advise on pest management options for sensitive



Course Entry Requirements

Our standard entry requirements include:

- ❖ **USI:** A Unique Student Identifier (USI) number (Refer: www.usi.gov.au)
- ❖ **LLN:** A Language Literacy and Numeracy (LLN) assessment (if deemed required).
- ❖ **Employment:** To ensure our students can apply their training in an industry environment, Rapid Training requires all enrolling students to either be:
 - *Employed* or
 - *Pre-arranged & documented work placement**, under an accredited technician. *The [Work Placement Agreement form](#), signed by the accredited technician, must be submitted in the enrolment application.



Duration

Maximum Course Term: 18 Months
12-24 Months (Traineeship – term set by each state)

Minimum Course Term: Not Restricted

- 415-440 nominal hours of training and assessment
- The course is self-paced and flexible to suit your needs, students can complete units upon demonstration of competence.

Mode of Assessment

All units are assessed online, and methods include:

- ❖ **Theory Assessment:** *Students are required to complete a range of Multiple-Choice questions, Short Answer questions, Case Study & Scenario Based Assignments on the course lessons*
 - ❖ **Practical Video Assessments:** *Student are required to record a range of videos demonstrating their ability competently apply their skills and knowledge across three live sites*
 - ❖ **Logbooks:** *Student must complete the following logbooks under an accredited technician:*
 - 10 General Pest Inspections & Treatments (CPPUPM3005 & CPPUPM3006).
 - 10 Timber Pest Inspections (CPPUPM3008).
 - 10 Timber Pest Treatments (chemical) (CPPUPM3010).
 - 10 Timber Pest Physical Barrier applications (CPPUPM3042).



Course Outcomes

Successful completion of this course students will have the ability to comprehensively apply their knowledge and skill across the operations of the pest business for growth.

Students will be issued a nationally recognised **Certificate** upon completion of the course, and upon request, a **Statement of Attainment** for completed units of competency once licencing units are achieved.
