

Our General Pest Technician course has been designed to deliver the required minimum competencies for trainee Pest Technicians to achieve their General Pest Control license.

This qualification is offered through an online blended delivery method (online theory and assessment), whilst under supervision of a qualified Pest Technician.

In this course students will build knowledge and skills to operate competently and safely to:

- ❖ Identify general pests infestations (*cause and severity*)
- ❖ Develop and communicate management plans
- ❖ Select and maintain equipment and materials
- ❖ Complete applications using appropriate equipment

UNITS OF COMPETENCY

- ❖ CPPUPM3005 Manage pests without applying pesticides
- ❖ CPPUPM3006 Manage pests by applying pesticides
- ❖ CPPUPM3018 Maintain equipment and pesticide storage area in pest management vehicles

- ❖ **Logbook:** Students complete a logbook of 10 General Pest inspections & applications under supervision of a qualified technician.

- ❖ **Employment:** To ensure students can apply their training in an industry environment, all enrolling students must either be:
 - **Employed** in the pest control industry or
 - **Engage** a qualified technician to supervise and document **work placement***. *The Work Placement Agreement form, signed by the qualified technician, must be submitted within the enrolment application.

COURSE OUTCOMES:

Students will be issued a nationally recognised **Statement of Attainment** for completed units of competency.
